Analyze data to understand zone trends and history, highlight success stories, and outline a roadmap to achieve results.

- 2. Increase Partnerships of partnerships for funding (e.g., the next Gates Foundation), for large-scale projects utilizing matching funds, and for membership growth (e.g., trade, industry, and professional associations). Showcase Polio as a successful, replicable case. Leverage Rotary's credibility as an asset more intensively.
